June 23, 1960 - July 30, 2022

Candice “Candy” Ingle Lane, 62, of Cary, died Saturday, July 30, 2022 at her home surrounded by loved ones. Born on June 23, 1960 to Ron Ingle and Ann St. Clair, Candy was known for her smile that lit up the room, her contagious spirit, and her love for others, in particular her family.

Candy was the second born of four and known for loving life, her passion for swimming on the Lakemont swim team and anything that involved sports. Her love for Scott was unmatched and their unwavering commitment, steadfast compassion and heart of service for each other was evident up until Candy’s last moments on earth. Candy was an adoring mother who loved her girls unwaveringly. Samantha (Sami) and Natalia (Tali) were truly her greatest gifts. She beamed with pride at tae kwon do, softball games, dance recitals, and school functions. Candy was easy to talk to and made sure Sami and Tali knew the depths of her love for them and her desire to support them and their endeavors.

Candy was an athlete at heart. An incredible softball player, a black belt tae kwon do instructor, a regular at the YMCA, a participant in the Livestrong program, and loved tennis and pickleball. In her free time, Candy loved to volunteer and support causes she cared about including, but not limited to, causes benefiting cancer research and volunteering with the children’s ministry at Crosspointe Church.

To have known Candy is to have been loved by her. Whether you met her at the gym, work, the martial arts academy, church or the neighborhood, Candy’s warm smile, fierce love, and endless optimism drew you in and you were never the same. She always had a word of encouragement, keen intellect and was the most loyal and compassionate of friends. None of us will forget her smile that lit up the room or the heart that was behind it.
