Dearest Luise,
oder soll ich es in Deutsch sagen? I miss you so much, because we spent really memorable times together in Germany and later in Kings Park, Long Island. There were the times, when I was apprentice at Mercedes and we became friends despite Walter was my boss and our relationship was always carried by mutual respect. Luise and Walter drove a little Minicar NSU Prinz and I had a Fiat 600. We together traveled to the famous racetrack Nurburgring about 200 kilometers west of our hometown Marburg together and enjoyed the castor bean oil smell of the race cars in those times.

I think it was my fault that the Pfeiffers immigrated to America in 1964 or so. Walter always said, that he can not realize himself in Germany. He reached his limits in the automotive business and the German stakes for self-employment were too high. Most car mechanics started with a gas-station, but that was under Walter's level. So he followed my advice, worked second jobs part-time and sold the car, all the furniture, fridge and beds to get the money for the flight ticket to New York. Luise moved to her parents for a while - but not for long. Less than a year after, if I remember right, Walter sent Luise the ticket to follow him. And they were lucky - Walter found two partners to start a BMW dealership in Great Neck, Long Island and off they went with the success story. A house in Kings Park, two cars, a motorboat, both got their diver's license for scuba diving and both became members in a shooting club where they shot with rifles ... and Eileen was born. Ralf got a little sister.

All this was already in place, when I had finished my Air Force time where I became a pilot in 1969. I paid my first visit to Kings Park, Long Island in November that year and spent a couple of weeks with the Pfeiffer family - and then to start a cross country travel with Continental Trailways buses to Los Angeles, where my sister lives.

In 1977 I founded my own company GeoPetroleum in Frankfurt Germany for drilling and exploration oil and gaswells in the USA. And for 10 years I traveled almost every 2 month to my drilling sites in Clarksburg, West Virginia. About 50 times altogether. On my way back home, many times I made a stopover in Kings Park. Where I spent memorable times with the Pfeiffers. Especially I remember those September times (on my birthday), when the weather is still beautiful, we took the boat to the Long Island Sound. Luise and Walter dived down to the ocean floor in 20 meters and brought up fresh lobster. Luise cooked them in the evening. She was a magnificent cook - I will always remember.... I miss these moments in life.
