Alfred Hugh Tucker, Jr., better known as Hugh his entire life passed away on Saturday, January 16, 2021 at Transitions Hospice after a 2 1/2 year illness. He was born in Columbia, North Carolina on June 12, 1941 to Alfred Hugh Tucker and Minnie Ruth Cox Tucker. He was 79.

His early years were spent in Grimesland, North Carolina and after graduation from Grimesland High School in 1959 he attended ECU before joining the Navy where he was honorably discharged after serving 5 years.
