



## Clarence Richard "Pop-Pop" Moore

May 11, 1940 - April 7, 2025

Clarence Richard Moore, lovingly known by many as "Dick" or as "Pop-Pop," passed away peacefully on April 7, 2025, surrounded by the unwavering love of his wife, children and grandchildren. He was 84 years old.

Born in Durham, North Carolina, on May 11, 1940, Dick was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, and friend. He is survived by his beloved wife of 59 years, Yvette Moore, who stood faithfully by his side through every chapter of life.

Dick is also survived by his son, Edward Moore of New York, and his wife Julie; his daughter, Susan Hickoff of Pennsylvania, and her husband Rick; nine grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. He was also a die-hard Baltimore Ravens fan, never missing a game and always cheering with unwavering loyalty—even from afar. Whether it was through football, scouting, or simply spending time with his family, Pop-Pop poured his heart into the things and people he loved.

To his grandchildren and great-grandchildren, he was “Pop-Pop”—a storyteller, a steady hand, and a source of boundless love. Special moments, family traditions, and the joy of being together will forever carry his spirit. Pop-Pop will be deeply missed, but his legacy of love, loyalty, and quiet strength will continue to inspire all who knew him.

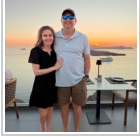
