November 7, 1997 - June 4, 2021

Daniel Scott Alford of Benson, NC, formerly of Greenville, NC, was killed in a single-vehicle automobile crash in the early hours of the morning on Friday, June 4, 2021.

Daniel was born on Friday, November 7, 1997, at Pitt County Memorial Hospital, now Vidant Medical Center, in Greenville. His early years education was augmented by several short-term residential education placements before attending J.H. Rose and Ayden-Grifton High Schools and ultimately earning his GED. Daniel only recently discovered that work is not such a bad thing when you enjoy what you are doing and who you are doing it with; his current work with Triangle Landscape Supplies in Apex taught him that lesson which he proudly shared, and for which we are grateful.

Daniel was preceded in death by his: maternal grandfather, James L. Halls; paternal grandparents Arthur S. (Ott) Alford and Betty J. (Bet) Alford McMahan; and uncle, Wesley Garrett (Gary) Alford.

Daniel is survived by his; mother, Tracie Halls Alford of Burgaw, NC; father and step-mother, Scott and Becky Alford of Chocowinity, NC; brothers, Matthew Alford of Nashville, NC, and Dillon Alford of Chocowinity, NC; and step-sisters, Tiffany Miller and husband Matthew of Durham, NC, and Kristen Sankowski, husband Steven and daughter Fiona of Greenville, NC; maternal grandparents, Ruth Dillon Halls of Wilmington, NC, and David and Renate Cooper of Leland, NC; numerous aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends.

Pit Bulls.
