His love of music was strong and bonded him with fellow music lovers. His skill of remembering dates always amazed me. I never saw him with a calendar. How did he do that? He was passionate about his friends. If someone wronged them, he would go on a tirade. Even if it wasn't his friend he could have a temper. He had strong opinions. He was very smart
