Joe retired from ALCOA, Inc. in Alcoa, TN where he was the Quality Assurance and Technical Manager for many years. He was a member of the Twenty-Five-Year Club and served with ALCOA in Tennessee, Indiana, Australia, and part of a joint venture with Kobe Steel in Japan.

Joe was a graduate of Vanderbilt University, earning a bachelor’s in Mechanical Engineering and master’s in Material Science. He was a member of the football and track teams, and an unwavering fan of the Commodores, holding season football tickets for nearly 50 years. He was also an original Tennessee Titans PSL holder.

As an Eagle Scout, Joe supported many Boy Scout Troops and Cub Packs as Scoutmaster, Cubmaster and Committee Chairman. He was a Life Member of the Executive Board of the Boy Scouts Great Smoky Mountain Council and proudly witnessed both of his sons achieve the Eagle Scout Rank.

Joe’s commitment to stewardship called him to various leadership roles within the Alcoa

Rotary Club, American Society of Metals, and the Alcoa Salaried Retirees Club of Eastern Tennessee and the Western Carolinas. A lifelong learner and hobby genealogist, Joe was an active member of the American Clan Gregor Society.

In addition to visiting every major league baseball stadium in the U.S. with his son, Brandon, Joe was one of the few to visit all seven continents, more than fifty countries, and all 3,143 counties in the United States.
