Nancy Jones Mills, 77, of Cary, North Carolina, won her five year battle against leiomyosarcoma and met her Great Physician and Healer, Jesus Christ, on Friday, August 7, 2020. To God be the glory! She was born on March 11, 1943, in Apex, North Carolina, to Homer Ray and Annie Pierce Jones. She was preceded in death by her husband, Raymond N. Mills, Sr., and her parents.
