Rose Marie Berthiaume's funeral will be held at 11:00 am, Thursday, January 27th at Saint Andrews church in Apex. The family will receive guests at 10:00 am followed by eulogies at 10:50.

Rose Marie Berthiaume, 81, died at home with her family by her side on December 22, 2021 in Raleigh, NC after a long, heart-breaking period of physical and mental decline inflicted on her by Alzheimer's.

Rose Marie was born in Buffalo, NY, to the late Edward and Rose Fischer. She married her husband, Thomas Berthiaume, in 1962 to whom she was lovingly devoted for 59 years.

She is survived by her children Kimberly "Kim" Berthiaume (Roger Nisbet) of Cary, NC; Patricia "Trish" Duplay (Dave) of Flemington, NJ; and Lisa Pierce (Joey) of Fuquay-Varina, NC. Rose Marie's family also includes her six grandchildren on whom "Nanny" doted endlessly: Steve Metcalf (Skye Bacus) of Denver, CO; Eric Metcalf, who predeceased her in 2012; Christopher "Chris" Duplay of Stowe, VT; Elizabeth "Lizzie" Duplay of Boston, MA; Emily Larson of Holly Springs, NC; and Megan Larson of Apex, NC. Beside her for Rose Marie's entire life was her beloved identical twin sister Ann Liotti (Tony, deceased) of Rochester, NY— her "better half" as they both said of each other – and her younger brother, Tim Fischer (Tobey) of Syracuse, NY as well as a host of nieces and nephews to whom she was very close.

Rose Marie graduated high school from Sacred Heart Academy and completed her collegiate studies at Sisters of Charity Hospital, both in Buffalo, NY, where she became a registered nurse. She met Tom on a double date in Baltimore, MD where the twins were practicing psychiatric nursing at Seton Institute. Set up by Ann's soon-to-be husband, the two couples danced the twist at Fort Meade Officers Club and after that first weekend Tom was dazzled, soon proposing to Rose Marie after a whirlwind romance. Bonded from that point forward, the couples were a lifelong foursome, raising their families side-by-side and

traveling together to countless destinations across America through the years.

Rose Marie began her married life in Yorktown, VA where Tom was stationed in the United States Navy. Soon thereafter, they moved to Rochester, NY where Rose Marie spent the following years of her life dedicated to raising her three daughters and making a warm and welcoming home for her beloved family. In 1976, the family moved to Weatherford, OK where Rose Marie developed a life-long love for red clay dirt and tumbleweeds; Silverado pickup trucks (when she wasn't buzzing around in her red Fiat); bronc rodeos (replete with Shepler's pointed-toe cowboy boots that she styled in her unique way); and the myriad charms of small-town life near the panhandle of what became her favorite state. Rose Marie never met a football game she didn't like, cheering loud and long for her Oklahoma Sooners – especially when they played Tom's Notre Dame Fighting Irish. Near the end of her husband's career with 3M, the couple moved to St. Paul, MN where Rose Marie was always too cold for her liking, but nonetheless embraced the icy northern lifestyle before retiring to Cary, NC in 1994. For the next few decades, Rose Marie reveled in warmer climates and the joy of being the center of her Brookstone community where she cooked up countless exquisite meals hosted in her boisterous dining room (always pulling up one more chair to the table for family and friends that constantly gathered), served as adopted grandparents to all the neighbors, and endlessly poured wine to accompany late-night laughs on her back porch – only fussing when too many cigars were lit.

More than a phenomenal wife, wonderful mother and gracious hostess to so many, Rose Marie was kind and warm at her essence, a woman of unflagging faith who served her church in myriad ways that signaled her dedication to her deep faith. Offering trademark hugs, beautiful smile, and "I love yous" to so many, Rose Marie never met a stranger and was, quite simply, a generous and lovely woman.
