It is with great sadness that the family of Toni Jane Koerner, known to her family as Nana, announces her passing on Sunday, January 6th, 2019 at the age of 71.

Toni was born June 5th, 1947 in Fayetteville, NC, the adopted daughter of William and Lucy Martin.

Toni graduated in 1966 from Seventy-First High School in Fayetteville, NC. She has strong ties to the class of 1965, as well.

Toni earned her Nursing degree from Macon College in the mid-nineties, making news for her perfect score on the State exam and leading to a rewarding career as an RN in Warner Robins, Georgia. Along with her husband, she retired and moved to North Carolina in 2005 to be closer to her daughter and grandchildren. She never shied from the hard work of nursing and felt great pride in her ability to help those in need.

While living in Georgia, Toni was a faithful member of Westminster Presbyterian Church and sang in the choir, something she loved to do. Though her last years were marred by health issues, Toni remained faithful to the Lord and loved Him above all else. Her positive attitude, integrity and character never wavered in the face of adversity.

In August 2018 Toni was preceded in death by the love of her life for over 53 years, James Arthur Koerner. Wed in February 1965, they embodied true love and devotion, and through their strong faith they are now together again.

Toni is survived by her daughter Donna Koerner, of Byron, GA, her daughter Evie Burgess (husband Rodney), and her beloved grandchildren, Cameron and Ryan Burgess, all of Cary, NC.

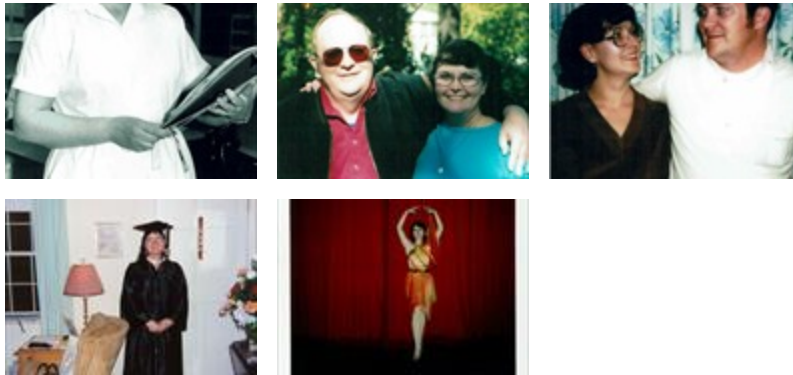
